

11. MANAGEMENT OF THE CLUB.

- 11.1. There will be meetings held at regular intervals with all the Officers of the Club and other nominated members of the Club, to discuss and maintain the general running order of the club. Such meetings will be known as managers meetings and those present as the Club Committee.
- 11.2. Team representatives not attending three consecutive managers meetings will be asked to come before the Club Council to give an explanation. Managers, coaches or a team representative must attend each managers meeting.
- 11.3. Team managers and coaches will be introduced at managers meetings for acceptance unless elected at the Annual General Meeting. If a change in team management is required, it must first be submitted to the Club Council for checking of adequate references, prior to the event. New managers will be required to present themselves before the Club Council and conform to the requirements of the F.A. Charter.
- 11.4. If a team manager wishes to resign from the Club they must first inform, in writing, the Club Chairperson and Secretary before informing their team. Their team then becomes the responsibility of the Club Committee.
- 11.5. By special arrangement of at least two thirds of the Club Council any team manager or coach not fulfilling their role towards the Club may have their manager ship terminated.
- 11.6. The Club Committee will decide in which league teams will be placed, after serious consideration has been given to the respective team manager's opinion.
- 11.7. Any dispute regarding the interpretation of the Constitution or rules of the Club will be referred to the Club Council and their decision will be binding.
- 11.8. Should the Club close down and after all outstanding debts have been paid, the remaining property will be given to the local authority for the use of children's football.

12. CHILD PROTECTION.

- 12.1. The Club will endeavour to provide a safe and supportive environment in which children and young people can enjoy their football.
- 12.2. The Club shall at all times strive to demonstrate best practice in the area of child protection and to follow The Football Association's guidelines.
